Nene Valley colour-coated ware

Fine tableware with a wide distribution across Britain from the 2nd to the 3rd centuries AD. Hard, smooth-textured fabric; white, off-white or pink; very fine quartz sand, occasional larger grains. Nene Valley ware has been found outside Kenchester (Magnis),¹ and at the Romano-British settlement site at Stretton Grandison.²
